The following offices will be on the ballot. Offices with districts indicated are elected by voters living in those specific districts.

In order to vote in the State Primary election, you must choose which Party Primary (Republican or Democratic) you wish to vote in. The State of Tennessee is an open primary state, meaning a registered voter must declare their political party preference in order to vote in a primary.

Voter Registration Deadline– July 7, 2020

This is the registration deadline for the August 6, 2020 election. Persons not currently registered to vote in Montgomery County must do so by this date. There are several places to register to vote:

By-mail applicants must vote in-person the first time.

Note: All by-mail applications must be postmarked no later than 30 days before an election. You are not a registered voter until you receive your voter card.

All persons who have moved their residence are required to change their registration records with this office or they will be purged/removed from the records.

Voters are encouraged to make any changes or corrections to their voter registration record by the deadline. To change your name you are required to file a new registration form to update your signature.

Note: If you are currently registered in another Tennessee county or in another state you must complete an application for voter registration for Montgomery County, Tennessee. Voter registration does not transfer between counties or states.

Early Voting—July 17 – August 1, 2020

All registered voters are eligible to vote early. No reason is required to vote early. Early voting is held at the Election Commission office. Early voting begins the twentieth day and ends the fifth day before Election Day. This includes Saturdays and extended weekday hours.

Photo ID

All Voters must present a Tennessee state or federal issued photo ID, even if expired, whether voting early or on Election Day.

NOTICE: Federal law requires first time voters who register by mail to present one of the following:

• A current Federal or Tennessee State issued photo identification card with voter's name and photo OR

• An expired Federal or Tennessee State issued photo identification card with one of the following: a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck or other government document (ex. voter registration card) that shows the voter's name and address.
