Voter Registration Deadline-October 4, 2010

This is the registration deadline for the November 2, 2010 election. Persons not currently registered to vote in Montgomery County must do so by this date. There are several places to register to vote:

- ✓ On-line through the Tennessee State website, <u>http://tennessee.gov/sos/election/ss-3010.pdf</u>. Print application on white paper using black ink only.

By-mail applicants must vote in-person the first time.

Note: All by-mail applications must be postmarked no later than 30 days before an election. You are not a registered voter until you receive your voter card.

All persons who have moved their residence are required to change their registration records with this office or they will be purged/removed from the records.

Voters are encouraged to make any changes or corrections to their voter registration record by the deadline. To change your name you are required to file a new registration form to update your signature. Name changes can not be made by phone.

Note: If you are currently registered in another Tennessee county or in another state you must complete an application for voter registration for Montgomery County, Tennessee. Voter registration does not transfer between counties or states.

Early Voting-October 13 – 28, 2010

All registered voters are eligible to vote early. No reason is required to vote early. Early voting is held at the Election Commission office. Early voting begins the twentieth day and ends the fifth day before Election day. This includes Saturdays and extended weekday hours.
